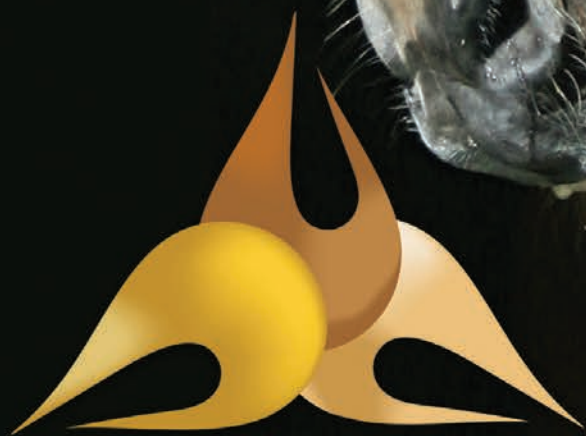

AMATEUR/OWNER

HANDLER DESCRIPTION: Amateur Handler - For the purposes of this show, an AMATEUR is one, who does not train horses under saddle or in harness for profit, or does not teach riding lessons or accept remuneration for showing horses in-hand, under saddle or in harness. One who trains horses in-hand only as part of a breeding operation is not disqualified as an amateur. In cases of dispute of amateur status, the Show Executive Committee will make the final decision. Owner Handler - For the purposes of this show, an OWNER is anyone owning any portion of a horse being competed.

The Show committee will not be responsible for conflicts that may occur, & classes WILL NOT be held up due to conflicts between events. Two minutes ONLY will be allowed for tack changes. Please review the class list & plan your classes accordingly.



Facility & Rules

LOCATION:

Frying Pan Park | 2709 West Ox Road, Herndon, VA 20171.

Concession stand open daily during show hours.

FACILITY RULES:

ALL HORSES MUST HAVE A NEGATIVE COGGINS IN ACCORDANCE WITH VIRGINIA STATE HEALTH REGULATIONS PRIOR TO ADMITTANCE TO FPHP. Coggins must be on-site and available for inspection. All horses shipping from out of state must have current health certificate and present it to the show office.

1. All horses must have their show number on their bridle or halter any time outside the stall.
2. Non-competing horses must be registered with the show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times outside of the stall.
3. \$25 schooling fee and stall fee must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have an official entry form and/or release form signed. School horses are not permitted in the warm up area during the competition hours. Fee does not apply to mare/foal as long as one of the pair is a registered competitor.
4. Shavings - shavings will be available at Frying Pan Park, \$9.00 per bag. Owners are allowed to bring their own acceptable bedding. Acceptable bedding is defined as bagged shavings, bagged bedding pellets, or bagged superior straw bedding.
5. Judges - it is the purpose of management to run the Horse Show at the highest possible level of sportsmanship. The management used the utmost care to select judges with broad experience and knowledge. The Judge's decisions in the show ring are their own responsibility and the management accepts no responsibility for those decisions.
6. Stabling - 12 x 10 stalls with doors. No initial bedding provided. Competitors are responsible for all stall damage. ABSOLUTELY NO nails, screw eyes in metal or wood. Every effort is made to honor stabling requests, but we cannot guarantee. When asking to be "stabled with" someone, please designate one name from your group in the "stable with" section of the entry form. Tack stalls shared between 2 or more competitors will receive at 10% discount.
7. Dogs - dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash or otherwise contained. Mounted riders may not lead dogs. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty. Fairfax County Animal Control will be contacted by park staff if rules are not followed.
8. Parking - is allowed in designated areas only. Violators improperly parked, including NO PARKING ZONES AND FIRE LANES, will be issued citations and/or towed from the premises at the vehicle owners expense. Users with a self-contained trailer/camper units may stay overnight parked in designated areas only. Trailer/Camper hook-ups to FCPA electrical outlets is prohibited.
9. SMOKING - No smoking is allowed in any building, including the barns and show office, at any time. All cigarette/tobacco products must be properly disposed of in the designated areas.
10. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES - ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ARE PROHIBITED IN THE PARK WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION FROM THE FCPA BOARD OF SUPERVISORS. At this time the Indoor Arena at Frying Pan Park is not approved for permitted or non-permitted alcoholic beverage consumption, sale, or distribution.
11. Security Notice - concealed weapons are prohibited in this facility.

Our Judges

Helen Brettell:

IDHSNA Dressage and FEH Judge

Helen is an 'S' licensed US Eventing judge and a FEI Level 2 Eventing judge.

Originally from Great Britain she has lived 12 years in Kenya and also Zimbabwe before running a boarding barn with 30 horses near Oxford UK. She holds the PC A certificate and the BHS instructor's qualification.

Before coming to USA she evented through advanced level successfully and both her sons evented and hunted whenever schooling permitted.

In 2005 she came to USA and has evented and hunted before turning her hand more fully to judging and teaching.

Tracy Mullen:

Hunter/Jumper Judge

Tracy is a USEF "R" Judge certified in Hunters and Hunt Seat Equitation, and a member of the United States Equestrian Federation, the United States Hunter Jumper Association and the Virginia Horse Show Association. She is the original founder of Tudane Farm in Long Island New York (1968), and is a long-time equestrian and horse professional.

Tracy has organized 4H groups and the Pony Club in Suffolk Co. She has bred, raised and trained Zone II and National ribbon winners in the Hunter Breeding Two and Three Year Old division, multiple Zone II Equitation Champions, and Hunter Champions.

In 1983, she was awarded Long Island Professional Horseman's Association Horseperson of the Year. Over the years she qualified riders for the AHSA Medal, ASPCA Maclay and USET Medal Finals and coached to Bronze, Silver and Gold USET Medals. Her students have been Regional Intercollegiate High Point Rider, National Intercollegiate Open Rider Champion, Cachione Cup winner, National Intercollegiate Alumni Rider and National Reserve Champion Rider.

Tracy relocated to Virginia in 1990 and turned the reins over to another in 1993, but continues to teach, train and coach in partnership with management.

Dr. Charlotte Moore:

Irish In-Hand Judge and Inspector

Dr. Moore has been breeding, producing and showing Irish Draught horses for almost 40 years. Along with her husband, Nigel, she has produced numerous winners at their Tullyroe Stud in Crumlin, Co. Antrim, Northern Ireland. This includes champions at the Royal Dublin Society, Royal Ulster Agricultural Society, National Breed Show and all-Ireland Championships. Sport horse produced at Tullyroe have evented to International level. Charlotte has judged and inspected Irish Draughts in Ireland, Great Britain, Canada, and the USA.

Michael Kirwan:

Inspector

Michael was born in the beautiful countryside near Thomastown, in Co. Kilkenny, an area of Ireland that has bred many international horses in Show Jumping, Eventing, and Racing. He also stood the first Registered Irish Draught stallion in Ballyduff.

Raised in a family of Irish Draught enthusiasts, Michael's father and grandfather worked and bred Irish Draught horses, a tradition which he continues today. Michael was a member of the IDHS in its early years and was a founding member of the Kilkenny branch. He was the first Chairperson for that branch, serving for eight years, and subsequently served as branch Secretary for years after. He also served as National Delegate for the Kilkenny branch for 12 years.

In his early years Michael was a successful rider of young horses in competition as well as riding to hounds with the Kilkenny Foxhounds and the Nore Vale Harrier Pack. He had several honorary positions with the hunt packs, including Field Master and 2nd Whip. He was Chairperson of the Nore Vale Harrier Hunt in Co. Kilkenny for several years.

As a member of the judges panel with the IDHS, Michael has judged at many of Ireland's major shows, including the Royal Dublin Show (RDS), judging national finals of foal and young horse classes, as well as the 2006 Irish Draught National Show in Galway. He is a member of the Inspection Panel and participated in the Northern Ireland Mare Inspections, the IDHSNA Inspections, and the UK Stallion Inspection Panel.

Michael represents many owners at the major horse sales in Ireland, the UK, and in Europe. With his family, he continues the horse tradition in both breeding and competition. All are keen students of conformation, movement and athleticism.

General Show Notes

RULES AND DEFINITIONS

The 2019 Annual Show Executive Committee reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to, or arising out of, or incident to, the show, without claims for damages or recourse of any kind.

- Any question not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the 2019 Annual Show Executive Committee, with their decision to be final. This includes the right to cancel, combine, split and/or add classes or divisions depending on entries.
- All horses must have a current Coggins, with the exception of horses under the age of twelve months are to use their dams Coggins. Horses over the age of twelve months must have their own current Coggins. All out of state horses must have a valid Health Certificate dated within 30 days of the start of the show. All horses being ridden must be at least three years old, all horses being ridden over fences must be at least four years old.
- For the purposes of this show, an AMATEUR is one, who does not train horses under saddle or in harness for profit, or does not teach riding lessons or accept remuneration for showing horses in-hand, under saddle or in harness. One who trains horses in-hand only as part of a breeding operation is not disqualified as an amateur. In cases of dispute of amateur status, the 2019 Annual Show Executive Committee will make the final decision.

FEH CLASSES FEH classes are to be held in accordance with USEA FEH Rules, which can be found on the USEA website. In these classes, horses are shown one at a time, and on the triangle. Please note that these classes are for horses between the ages of one and three years old. Yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle; two and three year olds must be shown in a bridle with either reins or a New Market shank. Handlers may request to use an assistant with a whip if they feel it is needed. Horses entered in the USEA FEH Series classes must use the USEA entry form and be registered with the USEA. Horses entered in the USEA FEH series do not have to be registered with the IDHSNA.

BREED IN-HAND CLASSES are to be held in typical IDHS fashion. Horses will be walked clock-wise around the ring. Each horse in the ring must have a handler at all times. Handlers are not to block the Judges view of the horse. Horses are to be turned to their right. Handlers can use an Irish Show Cane or dressage whip. The Ring Steward will assist the Judges in announcing to the handlers what they are to do.

DRESSAGE PROSPECT CLASSES are held in accordance with USDF Rules, which can be found on the USDF website. In these classes horses are shown one at a time and on the triangle. Please note that these classes are for horses between the ages of zero- and three-years old. Foals must be shown in a halter and may be accompanied by their dam (both animals require a handler at all times), yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle; two and three-year olds must be shown in a bridle, with either reins or a New Market shank. Handlers may request to use an assistant with a whip if they feel it is needed.

HUNTER CLASSES are judged in accordance with USEF rules.

In case of a tie, the horses with the most points over fences, will be awarded the higher placing. Hunter Pairs classes to be judged on similarity of horses/riders and quality of performance as a hunter pair. Jumper classes are judged in accordance with USEF rules.

JUMPER CLASSES, unless otherwise noted, will be run in accordance with USEF rules in Table II, Sec. 2(b), which means that the jump off occurs immediately following the course without leaving the ring.

ATTIRE: Recommendations for appropriate attire in each discipline. Note that this is left up to the judgment of the individual and in all instances the 2019 Annual Show Executive Committee would recommend a neat and tidy appearance.

- **DRESSAGE** – riders to dress in a black or navy jacket, stock, white shirt, cream or white breeches with black boots. Handlers in the Dressage Prospect classes typically wear a polo style shirt with khaki type pants/slacks and either Jodhpur boots or tennis shoes.
- **HUNTERS** – riders to dress in a riding jacket, shirt, appropriate choker, tie or stock, breeches, and boots.
- **IN-HAND** – handlers and assistants to wear appropriate attire for showing horses in-hand, allowing freedom of movement and protective hand, head and footwear is recommended. Suggested dress may include boots and breeches, khaki pants and button down or polo style shirt. Comfortable shoes for running. Riding helmet or hat is permissible.
- **JUMPERS** – riders are encouraged to dress in a riding jacket, shirt, appropriate choker or tie, however, collared shirts are acceptable along with breeches, and boots.
- **FEH SERIES** – handlers in FEH series classes typically wear a polo style shirt with khaki type pants/slacks and either Jodhpur boots or tennis shoes.

**At all times, appropriate safety head gear is to be worn by any and all mounted riders. **If the weather is extremely hot, it is up to the discretion of the 2019 show committee to determine acceptable riding attire.*

STALLION PARADE – participants in the Stallion Parade on Saturday, September 14, 2019 need to fill out a Stallion Parade Information Sheet on their stallion(s) and submit them to Ann Morss no later than Saturday, August 27, 2019 if they wish to participate in the parades. Forms are to be emailed to annmorss@msn.com.

PARKMORE PRIDE MEMORIAL YOUNG HANDLER CHAMPIONSHIP HAND – Competitors will be required to wear formal in hand show attire, shirt and tie or stock, Beige or dark pants, paddock boots, jacket and riding helmet. No polo shirts and ABSOLUTELY NO RUNNING SHOES ALLOWED. Under saddle: Competitors will be required to wear formal riding attire, shirt and tie or stock, breeches long boots, jacket and riding helmet.



Rules & Definitions

TURN OUT: Recommended minimum requirements for appropriate turn out for each discipline.

DRESSAGE – horse to be clean, manes braided. Appropriate bit, whip and spurs for the level of test being ridden. Horses tack to be in accordance with USDF rules.

COMBINED TESTS – horses to be clean, manes braided for the Dressage portion. Appropriate bit, whip and spurs for the level of the test/course being ridden. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEA rules.

HUNTERS – horses to be clean, manes braided. Appropriate tack for the type of class entered. Horses tack to be in accordance with USHJA rules.

IN-HAND – horses to be clean, manes on horse's one-year of age or older braided for the Irish Breed classes and Dressage. Purebred horses should not have their fetlock hair trimmed off. Horses tails should be neat and tidy.

JUMPERS – horses to be clean, manes need not be braided. Horses tack to be in accordance with USEF rules.

PARKMORE PRIDE MEMORIAL YOUNG HANDLER CHAMPIONSHIP
- Tack should be clean, well-fitting and in good, safe condition. During In-hand showing, competitors should be able to stand a horse up correctly for the judges and during the trot up should turn the horse away from them. Under saddle the riders should be able to recognize being on the correct diagonal in trot and strike off on the correct lead in canter.

COP - CERTIFICATE OF PEDIGREE:

- In 2016, the Certificate of Pedigree was launched to certify horses of Irish Draught lineage that can't be registered due to unapproved sires and dams.
- For the COP, a horse must be able to be DNA tested to a registered ID or IDSH to qualify.
- COP horses are being invited to compete at the Annual show in the Performance Classes alongside the registered ID and IDSHs and will be awarded their own placings and Ribbons, there will be a COP show champion! Classes 1 - 17, 20 - 25, 77, 82, 85, 88, 89, 73 - 87, and 45 - 70 are the Performance classes. COP horses are eligible for IDHSNA Year End Awards!
- Horses must have received their certification from the Office of the IDHSNA by the time of the show.

DIVISIONS LISTINGS & CLASS DEFINITIONS

DRESSAGE DIVISIONS:

- *Intro Level* (classes 1, 2 and 3) - Horses to perform the Intro Tests (A,B,C)
- *Training Level* (classes 7, 8 and 9) – Horse to perform the Training Tests (1, 2 and 3)
- *First Level* (classes 11, 12 and 13) – Horse to perform the First Level Tests (1, 2, and 3)

- *Dressage Suitability* (class 17) – This class is open to horses that have just started their careers. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on the horse's potential to become a Dressage mount.
- *Purebred/Partbred Dressage Prospect* (classes 18 and 19) – This class is open to horses from the age of zero to three-years old, to be shown on the triangle in accordance with USDF rules.

FUTURE EVENT HORSES:

- *Future Event Horse classes* (classes 20 - 25) – In these classes, horses are shown one at time and on the triangle. Please note that these classes are for horses between the ages of one and three years old. Yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle; two and three year olds must be shown in a bridle, with either reins or a New Market shank. Handlers may request to use an assistant with a whip if they feel it is needed. *NOTE: Exhibitors/owners of horses in the FEH series do not need to be members of IDHSNA, and their horses do not need to be registered with the IDHSNA, however, horses must be registered with USEA.*
- *FEH Yearling Division* (classes 20 and 21) - Open to yearlings. They will be judged on the triangle, and in accordance with USEA FEH rules. Yearlings may be shown in either a halter or a bridle.
- *FEH Yearling Fillies* (class 20) - Open to yearling fillies.
- *FEH Yearling Colts & Geldings* (class 21) - Open to yearling colts & geldings.
- *FEH Yearling Championship* - Open to horses that have won a first or second place ribbon in classes 20 and 21.
- *FEH Two Year Old Division* (classes 22 & 23) - Open to two year olds. They will be shown on the triangle, and in accordance with USEA FEH rules. Two year olds must be shown in a bridle.
- *Two Year Old Fillies* (class 22) - open to two-year old fillies Two Year Old Colts & Geldings (class 23) - open to two-year old colts and geldings.
- *FEH Two Year Old Champion* - open to horses that have won a first or second place ribbon in classes 22 and 23.
- *Three Year Old Division* (classes 24 and 25) - Open to three year olds. They will be judged on the triangle, in accordance with USEA FEH rules. Three year olds must be shown in a bridle.
- *Three Year Old Fillies* (class 24) - Open to three year old fillies
- *Three Year Old Colts & Geldings* (class 25) - Open to three year old colts & geldings.
- *Three Year Old Championship* - Open to horses that have won a first or second place ribbon in classes 24 & 25.
- *FEH Mountain Pearl Championship* - Open to the Champion and Reserve Champion for the yearling, two year old, and three year old division.



Rules & Definitions

BREED IN-HAND CLASSES AND DIVISIONS:

- *Purebred Filly Foals* (class 26) – This class is open to all purebred 2019 filly foals.
- *Purebred Colt Foals* (class 27) – This class is open to all purebred 2019 colt foals.
- *Purebred Foal Championship* - Open to 2019 foals who received a first or second place ribbon in class 26 or 27.
- *The Mountain Dove Tribute Class* for RID Mares Four-years Old and up (class 28) – Open to RID Mares four years of age or older.
- *Purebred Yearlings* (class 29) – Open to Purebred 2018 fillies, colts, and geldings.
- *Purebred Two-Year Olds* (class 30) - Open to Purebred 2017 fillies, colts, and geldings.
- *Purebred Three-Year Olds* (class 31) - Open to Purebred 2016 fillies, colts, and geldings.
- *Purebred Youngstock Championship* – Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 26, 27, 29, 30 and 31.
- *Purebred Female Championship* – Open to mares and fillies who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 26, 28, 29, 30 and 31.
- *Purebred Geldings Four-Years Old and up* (class 32) – Open to RID geldings four years old and older.
- *Purebred Stallions Four-Years Old and up* (class 33) – Open to RID stallions four years old and older.
- *Purebred In-Hand Championship* – Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbons in classes 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32 and 33.
- *Get of Sire* (class 34) – Two to three get of a single RID sire to be judged as a group. Use appropriate tack and turn out for the age of each entry. Coordination with the Stallion Owner is recommended. Entry for this class will occur at the show no later than 9:00 AM on Saturday, September 14, 2019.
- *Progeny of Dam* (class 35) - Two or more progeny of a single RID Dam to be judged as a group. Use appropriate tack and turn out for the age of each entry.
- Coordination with the Mare Owner is recommended. Entry for this class will occur at the show no later than 9:00 AM on Saturday, September 14, 2019
- *Partbred Filly Foals* (class 36) – Open to all partbred 2019 filly foals.
- *Partbred Colt Foals* (class 37) – Open to all partbred 2019 colt foals.
- *Partbred Foal Championship* - Open to 2019 foals who received a first or second place ribbon in class 36 and 37.
- *Partbred Mares Four-years Old and up* (class 38) - Open to RIDSH

Mares four years of age or older.

- *Partbred Yearlings* (class 39) – Open to Partbred 2018 fillies, colts, and geldings.
- *Partbred Two-Year Olds* (class 40) - Open to Partbred 2017 fillies, colts, and geldings.
- *Partbred Three-Year Olds* (class 41) - Open to Partbred 2016 fillies, colts, and geldings.
- *Partbred Youngstock Championship* - Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 36, 37, 39, 40, and 41.
- *Partbred Geldings Four-Years Old and up* (class 42) – Open to RIDSH geldings four-years old and older.
- *Partbred Stallions Four-Years Old and up* (class 43) – Open to RIDSH stallions four-years old and older.
- *Partbred In-Hand Championship* - Open to horses who received a first or second place ribbon in classes 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, and 43.

JUNIOR HANDLER: (44) Open to handlers 18 years and under. Handlers may handle yearlings, two year olds, three year olds, mares, and geldings (stallions not permitted).

- To be judged on handling technique and turnout of horse and handler.
- Competitors to be judged over the duration of the show on barn management and etiquette, handling technique and turnout of horse and handler. Handlers are required to braid their own horses. Handlers to wear a helmet if handling a yearling, two year old or three year old.

YOUNGSTOCK UTILITY: (88) Purebred and Partbred horses ages yearling to three year old will be judged over a series of obstacles which could include walking over a tarp, backing through an L, having an umbrella opened, or opening a gate.

- To be judged on relaxed navigation through the course.

THE SNOWFORD BELLMAN AWARD - Open to all horses and handlers; not open to professional handlers. The intent of this award is to recognize a special relationship between the handler and their horse. This award is to be presented to the combination that may not be a winning one, but the partnership has demonstrated their best abilities in showmanship, presence, turnout and training. To be judged by the Irish Judges over the course of the In-Hand classes during the show.

HUNTER DIVISIONS:

- *Warm Up Class* (class 45) - This class is for horses that are just beginning their careers; choice of either 18" or 2' fences.
- *First Timers Hunter* (class 47) – This class is for horses that are just beginning their careers; they must be able to jump 6 fences at 18".



Rules & Definitions

- *Baby Green Hunter* (classes 48, 49, & 50) - This division is for horses that are in their first or second year of showing and must be able to jump 8 fences at 2' and walk, trot and canter in a group.
- *Rusty Stirrup* (51, 52, & 53) This division is for riders that are novice riders or are have not ridden for a number of years. There will be 8 fences at 2' and a walk, trot, canter in a group.
- *Novice Hunter* (classes 54, 55 & 56) - This division is for horses that have not won a division championship at 2'6" or higher. They will jump a regular hunter course at 2'6".
- *Junior Hunter* (57, 58, & 59) Riders under age 18 will jump a course of fences at 2'6".
- *Fox Hunter Turnout* (class 60) Both horse & rider will be judged on turnout. Attire and tack to be appropriate for the hunt field.
- *Fox Hunter* (61, 62, & 63) - Horses will jump 2'6" - 3'0" and may be asked to demonstrate hunter field skills (i.e., open/close a gate, drop a pole, lead over a fence, back 5-steps, etc.). Note that one fence will be taken at the discretion of the rider to best demonstrate their horse's suitability as a field hunter.
- *Warm Up 3'* (64)
- *Low Hunter* (classes 65, 66, & 67) – Horses will jump a hunter course of fences at 3'.
- *Working Hunter* (68, 69, & 70) – Horses will jump a hunter course of fences at 3'3"-3'6".
- *Purebred/Partbred Irish Hunters Horses* (classes 71 and 72) – Horses to be shown under saddle at a walk, trot, canter, halt, back 5-steps, and hand gallop in both directions of the ring. A riding judge will mount and ride each horse. The horses may have their saddles removed, asked to be set up and shown in hand at the walk and trot for the conformation portion of the class.

JUMPER DIVISIONS:

- *Puddle Jumpers* (classes 73 and 74) - These two classes are for horses that are in their first or second year of showing over fences and must be able to jump 8 fences at 2'.
- *Baby Jumpers* (classes 75 and 76) - These two classes are for horses that have not won a division championship at 2'6" or higher. Horses must be able to jump a course at 2'6".
- *Level One Jumpers* (classes 78 and 79) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 2'9" – 3'.
- *Junior Jumpers* (80 and 81) Riders under 18 will jump a course of fences 2'9" – 3'.
- *Level Two Jumpers* (classes 83 and 84) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 3'0" – 3'3".
- *Level Three Jumpers* (classes 86 and 87) - Horses will jump a course of fences at 3'3" - 3'6"

COMBINED TEST DIVISIONS:

- *Beginner Novice* (Classes 4 and 77) will perform USEA 2018 Beginner Novice Test B and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 2'7"
- *Novice* (classes 5 and 82) – Will perform the USEA 2018 Novice Test B and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 2'11".
- *Training* (classes 6 and 85) – Will perform the USEA 2018 Training Test B and jump a regular jumper course set at a maximum height of 3'3".

PARKMORE PRIDE MEMORIAL YOUNG HANDLER CHAMPIONSHIP:

Open to 16 – 21 year olds. To be judged on barn management, riding and/or showing in hand. Competitors will be judged in four sections:

- Their ability to prepare a horse for show (bathing and braiding).
- Put on a bridle and correctly fit a saddle.
- Show a horse in hand and correctly present the horse to the judges, or show a horse under saddle.
- Turn out of Handler.
- Prize awarded of trophy to the winner in addition to a 1 week training course at Parkmore Stud with Fleur Bryan.

Irish Draught Breed Standard

The Irish Draught Horse is an active, shortshinned, powerful horse with substance and quality. It is proud of bearing, deep of girth and strong of back and quarters.

Standing over a lot of ground, it has an exceptionally strong and sound constitution. It has an intelligent and gentle nature and is noted for its docility and common sense.

HEIGHT: Stallions 15.3hh to 16.3hh approx. Mares 15.1hh to 16.1hh approx.

BONE: Good, strong, clean bone. For a stallion of 16 hh, the IDHSNA recommends a minimum of 9" bone.

HEAD: Good, bold eyes set well apart, wide forehead and long, well-set ears. Head should be generous and pleasant, not coarse or hatchet headed, though a slight roman nose is permissible. The jawbones should have enough room to take the gullet and allow for ease of breathing.

SHOULDERS, NECK AND FRONT: Shoulders should be clean-cut and not loaded, withers well defined, not coarse; the neck set in high and carried proudly, showing a good length of rein.

The chest should not be too broad and beefy. The forearms should be long and muscular, not caught in at the elbows; the knee large and generous, set near the ground, and the cannon bone straight and short, with plenty of flat clean bone, and never back at the knee (calf-kneed) i.e. not sloping forward from knee to fetlock.

The bone must not be round or coarse. The legs should be clean and hard with a little hair permissible at the back of the fetlock, as a necessary protection; the pasterns strong and in proportion, not short and upright nor long and weak. The hoof should be generous and sound, not boxy or contracted and there should be plenty of room at the heel.

BACK, HINDQUARTERS, BODY AND HIND LEGS: The back is to be powerful, the girth very deep. The loins must not be weak but the mares must have enough room to carry a foal. The croup to buttocks is to be long and sloping, not short and rounded or flat-topped; hips not wide and plain. Thighs are strong and powerful and at least as wide from the back view as the hips, with the second thighs long and well-developed. The hocks are near the ground and generous, points not too close together or wide apart but straight; they should not be out behind the horse but should be in line from the back of the quarters to the heel to the ground; they should not be overbent or in any way weak. The cannon bone, etc. as for the foreleg, short and strong.

ACTION: Smooth and free but without exaggeration and not heavy or ponderous. Walk and trot to be straight and true with good flexion of the hocks and freedom of the shoulders.

COLOR: Any strong whole color, including grays. White legs, above the knees or hocks not desirable.

THE IRISH DRAUGHT

Over a century of selection has produced a warm-blood breed which is very sound, sensible animal with good bone, substance and quality. The Irish Draught is neither as massive nor feathered as its name infers and has movement that is smooth and free, without exaggeration, and not heavy or ponderous.

Standing over a lot of ground, the Irish Draught has an exceptionally strong constitution, great stamina and an uncanny jumping ability. In addition, this breed is very people-oriented and possesses a fabulous temperament made up of willingness, intelligence, docility and common sense.

The Irish Draught make excellent mounts for the amateur, novice and professional rider, having the ability and versatility to participate in various levels of jumping, eventing, dressage, hunting and driving events.

It is these exceptional qualities that also make the Irish Draught highly sought after in the breeding world as an invaluable and irreplaceable element in the production of the highly successful Irish Draught Sport Horse.

Ever since show jumping had its birth in Ireland, the Irish Draught has played a major role. A complete package in its purist form, the Irish Draught must be acknowledged for its potent and unparalleled contribution in the creation of the magical cross; the Irish Draught Sport Horse.

THE IRISH DRAUGHT SPORT HORSE

The even temperament, durability and power of the Irish Draught, mixed with the speed and athleticism of the Thoroughbred, creates a potent mix that is well up to the demands of modern day competition. World famous for its jumping and cross-country ability, this Irish Draught / Thoroughbred cross is not only a top caliber international athlete, but can serve as a perfect novice mount, adeptly boosting the confidence of a lower-level rider. The Irish (Draught) Sport Horse is a great ambassador of the Irish Horse industry and is responsible for Ireland's position as the number one Horse Breeding Nation.

Although we have recently seen the introduction of crosses with other bloodlines, such as top quality Warmbloods, Arabians and Quarter Horses which are showing great promise, it is still the RIDxTB cross that has achieved world-wide recognition. Cruising, Cagney, El Campion's Ado Annie, Eezy Carling King and Hopes are High are some of the shining stars of the Grand Prix circuit, and Custom Made, Supreme Rock, Giltedge and Sailing have thrilled us in the eventing world.

This magical cross was once known as the 'Irish Hunter' and is now referred to as the Irish Draught Sport Horse in North America and the Irish Sport Horse in Europe.

While it may seem confusing, there is a reason for the difference in names. The Irish Draught Sport Horse is recognized by North America (IDHSNA and IDHSCan) as a crossbred animal with a portion of RID (Registered Irish Draught) blood. The Irish Sport Horse is recognized by the Irish Horse Board, as an animal of ANY breeding, which may or may not have Irish Draught blood in its pedigree, although quite a few of the top Irish Sport Horses do possess some Irish Draught blood.

It should be understood that the IDSH is not a special breed or a 'product' of an "American" breeding program. It is simply a moniker aimed at educating the public about the Irish Draught blood that is so prevalent in many of the top performance animals.

Whether the cross is known as an Irish Draught Sport Horse, an Irish Sport Horse or even as an Irish Hunter, if there is Irish Draught blood running in those veins, you have one great horse!
